



SLS 1501: Strategies For Success

- SLS 1501 is a 3-credit hour, elective course that counts towards graduation hours.
- As a high-impact practice for college success, students learn important academic skills needed to be successful at UCF. These include goal setting, college-level research, writing, and the basics of being a college student!
- Helps reduce the academic and social barriers students face in their first-year of transitioning to college, and undoubtedly will help them be successful in their academic career at UCF
